

## Coalition for Hourly Instructional Programs

At a time when the need for extended learning opportunities and intensive intervention have reached a critical point, state funding for most supplemental instruction has been hit with crippling deficits. For the past several years local educational agencies have received less than 75¢ on the dollar for the Grade 2-6 Program for at-risk students. A similar deficit was applied to the Grade 2-9 Program in 2005-06, and the Core Academic program, which is the only option to offer enrichment opportunities, has been receiving around 90¢ on the dollar.

In addition to troubling deficits, recent changes in law have placed constraints on how such funding may be accessed. These changes have hit high schools especially hard since they must now rely on the limited pool of Core Academic funding to offer unit recovery/remedial offers to students who have failed courses.

In 2006-07, supplemental programs received some attention by the Legislature and Governor, but the problems of ongoing deficits and program inflexibility remain. We believe that the Legislature and Governor need to hear the voice of the field to prompt action that makes hourly supplemental programs a viable and effective option for remediation, intervention, and enrichment.

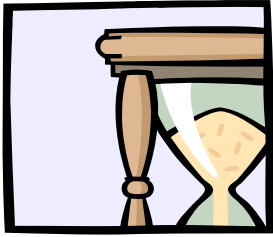
Local educational agencies that join CHIP will receive support in the following areas:

- Legislation Sponsorship
  - ◇ Remedy hourly instructional program deficits
  - ◇ Establish rules and guidelines to stabilize hourly program funding
  - ◇ Increase flexibility regarding how the funding can be used to support effective intervention programs and address remediation needs
- Technical Support
  - ◇ Regular information bulletins with tips on how to maximize hourly program support
  - ◇ Customized data reports that identify for your local educational agency how to better leverage available hourly program resources
  - ◇ School Services' consultation support to address specific questions and concerns
- Operational Guidance
  - ◇ Compile and disseminate data and research regarding effective and promising supplemental instruction practices
  - ◇ Support a virtual clearinghouse of helpful resources to inform the management of supplemental programs

We hope you will join CHIP to lend your voice to this important cause. The Governor has stated that 2008 will be the year of education reform; let's not miss the opportunity to shape what "reform" looks like.
